NOTICE OF RACE

Aloha Attitude as the Local Organizing Authority (LOA), under specified conditions laid down by the International Phantom Association, as the Organizing Authority (OA) is pleased to invite Phantom sailors to take part in these events scheduled for

September 8st – 13th 2018
Brest Moulin Blanc, France

[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is applied according to the RRS Introduction - Notation.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. No National prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3. If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.4. For Medal Races, World Sailing Addendum Q, Umpired Fleet Racing, will apply and change a number of racing rules. The version that is current when the regatta begins will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

2. [DP] ADVERTISING & SAIL INSIGNIAS & NATIONAL FLAGS

- 2.1. Sails and competitors may be required to carry advertising for event sponsors, which will be supplied by the local organizing committee in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20 – Advertising Code.
- 2.2. On the sail and the boat, the event sponsor's branding shall be placed conform to a special notice.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY REGULATIONS

- 3.1. The 2018 International Phantom Championships shall be open to competitors of all nationalities.
- 3.2. A minimum of five entries is required for each event to constitute a valid championship.
- 3.3. The deadline for valid entries is by 2400hrs (UTC) on **August 24th 2018**.
- 3.3.1. Entries may be accepted after this deadline at the discretion of the Local Organizer Aloha Attitude
- 3.4. Eligible competitors shall **enter online** with payment in euros by credit/debit card or bank transfer before the entry deadline.
 - 3.4.1. An entry is not valid until paid.
 - 3.4.2. 50% of entry fees may be refundable if accompanied by a medical certificate issued by a medical doctor stating a valid reason why the competitor cannot compete.
- 3.5. The following documentation will be required at Registration on site:
 - 3.5.1. Proof of valid third party liability Insurance
 - 3.5.2. Proof of age (passport).
 - 3.5.3. A completed **Parental Permission Form** for entries under the age of 18 years. This form may be completed online but a printed copy shall be brought to registration.

4. FEES

- 4.1. The Entry Fee is **250** euros.
- 4.2. The Entry Fee paid after the deadline as stated in NOR 3.6 shall be **350** euros.

FORMAT

- 5.1. The regatta will consist of an Opening Series and, provided a minimum of 6 races have been completed in the Opening Series, a Medal Race.
- 5.2. Six races can be scheduled each day. On the last day one Medal Race is scheduled with one further Opening Series race for those not assigned to the Medal Race.
- 5.3. The schedule is set irrespective of planing conditions.

7. [DP] EQUIPMENT AND EQUIPMENT CHECKS

- 7.1. Equipment is not supplied by the Organizing Authority and all competitors shall use their own equipment. Equipment that is loaned or chartered shall be considered to be the competitor's own equipment.
- 7.2. Measurement and equipment checks may be made throughout the event.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 8.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available at the on-site Registration.

10. COURSES

- 10.1. At the discretion of the Class Course Representative the course will be Longue distance, Windward-Leeward or other Stadium format. The courses may have Reaching or upwind start.
- 10.2. For the Medal Races the course will be, at the discretion of the Class Course Representative.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

As soon after the incident as possible, a boat takes a penalty by completing one of the following:

- a) Two consecutive gybes with the gennaker completely furled at some time between the two gybes.
- b) Two consecutive tacks
- c) When identified as OCS
 - 1) and when the first leg is identified by the race committee as a windward leg, a boat shall return entirely to the prestart side of the starting line and cross the starting line in the direction of the first mark, or
 - 2) on a leg identified by the race committee as a reaching leg, being clear astern of all boats that have started correctly when they complete the first leg of the course, excluding those identified as delayed starters by the race committee.

12. INTERNATIONAL JURY

- 12.1. A national Jury will be appointed

13. SCORING

- 13.1 The Low Point System of RRS Appendix A applies as amended by Appendix B8.
- 13.2 Three races are required to be completed to constitute any valid Championship.
- 13.3 For a Medal Race, a minimum of 6 races is required to be completed to constitute an Opening Series.
- 13.4 A competitor's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst score(s) as follows (This changes RRS B8.A2.1):

- 13.4.1 Discards in Opening Series when racing in single Fleet:

Opening Series Races	Discards	Comments
1-3	0	No discard
4-10	1	One worst score discarded
11 or more	2	Two worst scores discarded

- 13.5 In Medal Races:

- 13.5.1 A competitor's score shall be double the number of points specified in RRS Appendix A4.1.

- 13.5.2 The score for these races shall not be excluded from the series score neither does the Medal Race score trigger any discards from results in Opening Series.
- 13.6 The competitors assigned to compete in the Medal Races will be ranked highest in the regatta except for a competitor disqualified from a Medal Race under rule RRS 5, 6, 7 or 69.
- 13.7 If no Medal Races are completed, competitors will be ranked according to overall scores in Opening Series. If no race in Final Series is completed then competitors will be ranked according to overall scores in Qualifying Series.

14. SUPPORT PERSONS & SUPPORT BOATS

- 14.1. Support Persons may [register online](#) with payment by credit/debit card or bank transfer. Payment made at the event venue at registration shall be in cash and Euros only.
- 14.2. The Support Person's Fee for registration received and paid by 2400hrs (UTC) on **June 24th, 2018** is **50** euros. Payment received after shall be **65** euros.
- 14.3. A registration is not valid until paid.
- 14.4. The following documentation shall be brought to the event Race Office before the Practice Race:
- 14.4.1. Proof of valid third party liability Insurance.
- 14.4.2. Boat driving license (if applicable).

15. [DP] SAFETY

- 15.1. Competitors shall carry a life jacket, an Helmet, a whistle and towrope.

16. PRIZES

- 16.1. Medals for the 2018 International Phantom Championships will be awarded to the first three and trophies/prizes
- 16.2. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Local organizer.

17. RISK STATEMENT

- 17.1. Rule 4 of the RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 17.1.1. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 17.1.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- 17.1.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 17.1.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 17.1.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the race organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 17.1.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- 17.1.7. The fact that the Race Committee conducts inspections, or not, of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race.

18. INSURANCE

- 18.1. Competitors shall possess valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1 million euros.
- 18.2. Coaches and support boat drivers shall also have valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1.5 million euros.
- 18.3. Failure to provide evidence of insurance cover may be penalized by exclusion from the event.

19. DRUG TESTING

- 19.1. Competitors are reminded of the World Sailing rules and regulations concerning the use of banned methods and substances. Drug testing may take place during the event.

20. TELEVISION AND MEDIA

- 20.1. In registering for the event, competitors automatically grant to the LOA and the Phantom Class Association the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of them, taken during the period of the event, for the said Championship as defined in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions in which he/she participates without compensation.

21. OFFICIAL CEREMONIES & DRESS CODE

- 21.1. Competitors should attend the Opening Ceremony, Prize Giving and Closing Ceremony.
 - 21.1.1. Smart casual clothes will be worn.

NOTICE OF RACE ENDS

The conditions that can be expected are: wind speed 8-25 knots, water temperature 16-20°C and air temperature 16-24°C.
